I. Opening - Chairperson Cummings called the meeting to order at 5:31 p.m.

III. Presentations and Reports

A. Budget Review – Brian Hardy

Mr. Hardy reviewed the Measure J budget, informing members that the Security and Seismic projects have approximately \$2.8 million remaining in the budget. The construction portion of the Citrus Valley High School Project (CVHS) is almost complete with approximately \$1.4 million in construction contracts to be paid. Mr. Hardy noted that the Measure J funds can only be used for specific items so there is a possibility that some bond funds may be returned in the future.

B. Project Update – Bernie Cavanagh and Brian Hardy

Mr. Cavanagh answered member questions about the purchasing of furniture and equipment for CVHS based on the current state of the economy. Mr. Cavanagh informed members that he and his staff always do research, with the help of the Purchasing Department, for the best costs when purchasing necessary items. He noted that, when acceptable, they purchase used merchandise that is in good condition.

Mr. Hardy provided the members with a slide show of the solar panels at CVHS and noted that summer school will more than likely be held at CVHS now, due to the solar installation. Mr. Hardy discussed the Security Camera Project, noting that it was going out to bid with a bid opening date of October 22nd. Redlands East Valley is top priority for this project with the middle schools, then elementary schools to follow. Member Brad Easter asked Mr. Hardy if the cameras were tied into the Redlands Police Department, Mr. Hardy stated that some of the cameras are. The project will take about 6 to 9 months to complete and there will be between 400 and 500 cameras throughout all school sites.


