REDLANDS, CA – The Educational Results Partnership (ERP) and the Campaign for Business and Education Excellence (CBEE) have recognized Redlands Unified School District (RUSD) as one of 20 honorees on their list of 2016 California Honor Roll Districts.

This is the third time Redlands Unified has received this district honor since its inauguration in 2013. RUSD has achieved the honor previously in 2013, 2015 and now this year in 2016.

“This distinction is significant in that it recognizes the work that our teachers, staff and students have done to significantly close the academic achievement gap,” said Redlands Unified School District Superintendent Lori Rhodes.

School districts receiving this distinction have demonstrated consistent high levels of student academic achievement, improvement in achievement levels over time and reduction in achievement gaps among student populations.

For school districts with high schools, the Honor Roll recognition also includes measures of college readiness.

“Our teachers and staff give their heart and soul to educating our students and it shows in our student achievement results,” said Miki Inbody, Assistant Superintendent, Education Services.

“We are very pleased that the achievement gap of our student groups is narrowing,” said Inbody.

In addition to this prestigious honor as a district, Redlands Unified School District is pleased to announce that 16 RUSD schools have been included on the 2016 California Honor Roll for their leadership in student achievement and their efforts to close the achievement gap.
